Time is running out to host an AFA CyberCamp



Registration to host an AFA CyberCamp closes on May 1st, 2022.

AFA CyberCamps are designed for high school and middle school students who are just getting into cybersecurity or who have cybersecurity knowledge and want to learn more. Camps are hosted by approved organizations and institutions that register with the CyberPatriot Program Office. These organizations include, but are not limited to, AFA Chapters, schools, universities, CAP squadrons, companies in industry, boys and girls clubs, etc.

Organizations interested in hosting a camp purchase a curriculum kit from

CyberPatriot consisting of instructor guides, student workbooks, PowerPoint modules, and demonstration software that students follow along with. It is the responsibility of the host organization to facilitate the logistics of the camp (camp facility, instructors, participant registration, hardware, etc.).

All camps are packaged as 5-day, 20-hour sessions (20 hours of material taught over five days) and must be conducted Monday through Friday during one of the available camp weeks.

Scholarship Opportunity for Platinum Tier Competitors



The National Cyber Scholarship Foundation is delighted to invite Platinum Division CyberPatriots to apply for free training scholarships (worth over \$3000!) to further their cybersecurity studies and gain a professional certification this summer. 50 training scholarships have been designated specifically for CyberPatriot players in their senior year of high school, and you can be considered by following 3 easy steps...

1. Any Platinum Division players interested in applying for a scholarship needs to be registered for the [CyberStart America](#) program before April 27th 2022 – if you have not already registered, please use [this link](#) so you can be identified as a CyberPatriot player! <https://cyberstart.io/CyberPatriot>
2. You will separately need to submit your team number and score to the NCSF team – if you use the registration link above, you will be sent a short form shortly afterwards to request this information. Alternatively (e.g. if you had previously registered for CyberStart America), you can submit your team name and score by email to support@nationalcyberscholarship.org before April 27th – use the subject line “CyberPatriot team details”.
3. After the CyberStart America program ends on April 27th, those who meet the eligibility criteria for a scholarship will be invited to complete the NCSF Scholarship Application Form – this invitation will be sent by email from hello@nationalcyberscholarship.org by April 30th.

Platinum Tier CyberPatriot competitors who do not meet the eligibility criteria for a scholarship award may still be awarded National Cyber Scholarship Semifinalist status, which includes a digital badge for your resume. Any other CyberPatriot players are also welcome to register for the CyberStart America program, and may qualify for [other awards](#).

Registering for CyberStart America will also give you free premium access to the CyberStart game platform until April 27th – you can choose whether or not to make use of this free program, but you might enjoy the challenges now that CyberPatriot is over!

International Spin-off | CyberSakura

CyberSakura, the Japanese spin-off of CyberPatriot's youth cyber defense competition, held its National Finals on March 26, 2022. From a field of 24 teams, the top three were invited to the in-person competition in Sabae, Fukui, Japan.

The event challenges included a Network Challenge and two Ubuntu 20 virtual machine Images. Teams prepared their individual competition spaces with their personal computers and their favorite snacks (a very important part of cybersecurity!). Following a short opening ceremony, the teams competed in a network challenge and a security challenge with two Ubuntu 20 virtual machine images.



Difficulties were faced by all teams, but team TAKENOKO was able to preserve and take home the first-place win!

ARLINGTON, Va. (AFNS) — Brig. Gen. Terrence A. Adams, Concepts and Strategy Air Force Futures Military deputy director, Headquarters U.S. Air Force, was awarded the President Joseph R. Biden’s Lifetime Achievement Award during a ceremony in Washington, D.C., March 20.

Adams was nominated by the Lowcountry Rice Culture Project, a Charleston, South Carolina-based clearinghouse and partnership builder for activities that explore, reveal, and reclaim the shared cultural inheritance of the Southeastern Lowcountry rice industry as a basis for promoting community development and advancing the cause of human dignity.




